The first few books will have no words. We will tell the children the story in school, and they will have to **re-tell the story at home**, and in school the next day.

Make sure your child can hold the book correctly, turn the pages, and speak clearly — so they can be heard!

Very soon you will meet the characters — mum, dad, Kipper, Chip, Biff and Floppy. There will be simple key words (e.g. and, a, the) in these books. **Please** help your child learn these key words.

Jolly Phonics

Jolly Phonics has started!

We're sure you're wondering what all these strange sounds and actions are at home, but before long you will become as good as your children if you practise together!

We will be learning **3 sounds each week**. Make sure they know each sound in their sounds book, and can write the sound in their handwriting homework book. **Please** check over your child's work to ensure each letter is correctly formed.

Ensure homeworks are completed on time and brought to school everyday. The teachers mark them and return them. Homeworks must be completed with a **writing pencil**.

Very soon we will try to join the sounds together to make words — we call this "**sounding out**" e.g. c-a-t cat! Have a go with this at home, or practise some robot talking e.g. "Where is your school b-a-g?" This will really help your child grasp reading.



Mad about Maths

We have been learning how to write the numbers 1 - 5. We are doing really well – our teachers are pleased!

Keep practising these at home — we always say that **practice makes perfect**! We teach the children little rhymes to go with each number...

- **1** start at the top, and down you run, that's the way we make a 1
- **2** round and back on a railway track, two, two, two
- 3 around a tree and round a tree, that's the way we make a 3
- 4 down and over, and down some more, that's the way we make a 4
- **5** down and around and a flag on high, that's the way we make a 5
