During the month of January our focus of interest is 'Winter' & 'Arctic animals', and in February, 'people who help us'. We will also talk about Chinese New Year and Valentines day. We will discuss how to keep safe and warm in winter, feeding the birds, people in the community who help us, cultural differences around the world, and we will support the children's recognition of colours, patterns and shapes. Please work with us in supporting your child's learning by encouraging them to match colours, shapes and count, e.g. their birthday candles, their toes, etc. Our numeracy focus in pre-school includes counting to 10, and above if the child is able, and to recognise some numbers. We will also be encouraging the children to count objects, focusing on 1-5 this term, and above if the child is able.

Lending library has started and the feedback has been very positive! The children are very excited to select their new books to share with you at home. Please make sure that you return the book bag and all of the contents on Tuesday each week to facilitate the smooth running of the library. A note will be sent home to those who have outstanding books which need to be returned. If your child's books are not brought back we will be unable to provide you with any further books until they are returned.

### Self Help Skills

The children are settling into a good lunch time routine and becoming quite independent with other Nursery processes. We would ask that together we support your child's developing self-help skills. Encourage them to put on and take off their own coat, use their knife and fork, set the table or tidy away their toys after play times, help to dress themselves, be more independent in their own toileting needs, etc. at home as well as at nursery. Often parents are pleasantly surprised at just how much their young child can do!

# You can help - Please close the outside door!!

The children are encouraged to be independent in nursery and this includes access to their boxes in the hall and putting their coats on their pegs. The children's safety is our primary concern and the danger of leaving the nursery door open is that anyone can walk in, unpermitted by staff and a child could walk out. Please ensure that you close the door tight when you enter and exit the nursery. Thank you.

We welcome any old birthday or Christmas cards which you have received, we can use the front of the cards to practice cutting skills and to use in our craft activities, pull the back of the card off if you do not wish personal information to be shared. We are also asking for any chocolate boxes (we would like to make chocolate play dough around valentines day and the boxes would provide a fun filled activity at the playdough table!). Thank you.

Once again we would like to remind everyone that we welcome our parents and carers into the nursery to join in with the fun! The nursery doors open at 1.15pm everyday and you are able to join your child for table top time, up to 1.30pm.
