



Pupil Code of Conduct in Relation to Respect

Motto:

Respect for each other, and for ALL adults All of the time



Respect is a way of treating or thinking about something or someone. It is the due regard for the feelings, wishes, or rights of others. When people are insulted or treated badly, they feel they haven't been treated with respect.

We the pupils aim to treat each other, and all adults with respect all of the time. These behaviours include:

- Being kind, thoughtful and helpful
- Working and playing safely
- Being caring towards one another
- Co-operating with one another
- Treating one another fairly
- Displaying good manners
- Following instructions
- Listening to each other
- Following all of the rules in the classroom



Pupils should not be disrespectful to one another by behaving in the opposite manner to the points above and they should not engage in any bullying type behaviours. Name calling, hurting others physically and swearing is unacceptable.

Whether working or playing, our interactions with adults must be respectful at all times. Behaviours which are unacceptable include:

- Rolling eyes
- Answering back
- Interrupting
- Tone of voice
- Laughing or sniggering
- Walking away
- Not listening
- Pouting
- Huffing
- Being defiant (doing the opposite of what you are being told)
- Raising your voice
- Refusal to do what you are told
- Wilful refusal to give eye contact

Pupils who engage in these behaviours will be stood out and may be put into detention.
