Maths ideas for you at home

This half term we will focus on the numbers 1-20.

At home count together, write numbers, put numbers in order (smallest to biggest), and think about the number before, after and between. It is important that your child can recognise these numbers – try playing games with them!

Over the next few weeks keep an eye in their schoolbag for some more maths games you can play with them at home.

We have been talking about money – help your child to recognise all the coins up to £1. We will only be working with coins up to 10p in our toy shop, so why not play shop at home - start with using pennies.
