

ADMINISTERING OF MEDICINE



We wish to ensure that pupils with medication needs receive appropriate care and

support at school. While pupils should not be sent to school when they are acutely unwell or infectious, we realise that sometimes a doctor may advise pupils to attend school while still needing to take medication. As the responsibility for the administration of medicine lies with the parents, we ask that parents regulate the time for administering medicines so as to avoid the school day if possible.

The **Principal** will accept responsibility in principle for members of the school giving or supervising pupils taking prescribed medication during the school day where those members of staff have volunteered to do so. (Teachers have the right not to administer medication and may only agree to observe your child while taking medication in their presence).

Prescribed medication will not be accepted in school without an AM2 or AM3 medical form completed, written and signed instructions by the parent. These forms are available from the school office or you can download them from the school's website under the heading 'Parent Area'

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Dear Parent,

Despite early closure information relating to Monday 10th September being imparted in the following ways:

- A note in each child's school report envelope in June
- The September Bugle
- The website front page and calendar
- P2 Newsletter
- P.2 and P.3 parents reminded verbally at pick up time
- A text sent to all parents

37 pupils from P2 to P7 were collected late or not collected at all.

As a result of this, the 2 office staff, and myself, spent an hour contacting parents. The following reasons were given:

- forgot
- forgot to tell a grandparent or child minder
- didn't know about the early closure
- don't have time to read notes or go on to the website

This is not an isolated incident as too often children are left on early closures. 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EUROPEAN LANGUAGES DAY

Oh la la! You can't get a straight answer in plain, simple English in Ballykeel Primary School these days. It's all "Bonjour" this and "Auf Wiedersehn" that, thank you very much! Indeed, Ballykeel Primary School celebrated European Languages Day in style on Wednesday 26th September, adding a certain "je ne sais quoi" of their very own.

The school has been decked out with European flags and the various signs on the doors have been replaced with their French equivalents. The Principal's door sign has now become "La Directrice" while the caretaker's office now belongs to "Le Concierge". Even the canteen has gone European, offering a mouth-watering selection of dishes such as pizzas, enchiladas and profiteroles.

The aim of European Languages Day is to introduce the children to different languages cultures from across Europe and the world, and it was a resounding success! Every pupil, from the Nursery and P1s up to P7s, dabbled in a little bit of European and world culture. In total 9 different languages were taught throughout the school.

- The Nursery children, as well as P3CM, focused on Italy. They made their own pizzas and coloured in the Italian flag. The P3s also learned some basic greetings in Italian.
- P1KM heard about their teacher's life in Hungary. They learned some phrases, listened to Hungarian music and made and tasted some goulash.
- P1KH, P2JT, P4CC and Miss Hill introduced the children to Spanish. The children dressed up, played games, learnt some Spanish and tasted Spanish food. P4CC learnt Spanish greetings and Miss Hill, who is in charge of the school's Spanish Club, taught her pupils how to count up to 10 in Spanish during the Mad for Maths club.
- P5BE learnt some basic German phrases, how to count up to 10, and sampled German food.
- P2AS, P3LK, P4JDT, P6JF, P7JH, Mrs McIlwaine and Mrs Young went for French. The P2s learnt how to say the colours in French and made their own croissants. P3LK learned how to order food and drinks in a French café. Greetings, colours and numbers, as well as facts about France, were some of the areas covered in P4JDT and P6JF. Mrs Young introduced her pupils to French music and dance, P7JH learned to sing Frere Jacques in a round and Mrs McIlwaine taught directions in French to her P7 Maths group.
- P7SG learnt some Thai and Lao phrases, sampled some Thai foods and heard about their teacher's experience of travelling in Thailand and Laos.
- Mrs McKelvey's pupils learned about India. They explored some of the language and tasted Indian food.
- Last but not least, P5MA was lucky enough to have a visit from one of our parents, Mrs Oksana Tistanova, who comes from Ukraine. Oksana took time of off work to come and teach us some basic greetings in Ukrainian, and we also learned how to count up to 10. We were delighted to see her!

Our European Languages Day was thoroughly enjoyed by all. The whole school community was involved and it showed that learning a language is a fun and rewarding activity.
