Monthly themes





As well as other subjects which may emerge from the children's interests, we will plan to look at the following themes:

Over the next few weeks we will continue to talk about and investigate signs of autumn; colours observed in the outdoor environments, changes in weather, and items and objects which can be found at this time of year. The children will be using autumnal colours: brown, yellow, red and orange, in their creative activities and will be encouraged to bring in items and share their experiences to contribute to the learning and understanding of autumn. We will continue to talk about preparing for winter in autumn (both people and animals). We will be sharing a selection of stories about woodland and various animals with the children and will also talk and learn about migration and hibernation. We will look at the changes in the weather and the need to dress appropriately according to these changes (coat, hat, gloves, etc. as the weather gets colder and waterproofs for wet weather).

In November and December, we will be talking about *Christmas* and *the nativity*. We will continue to look at the change in the weather – you never know, we may even see some frost/snow! We will talk about the *Christmas* story and the meaning of *Christmas*. We will also be practising for our nursery *Christmas* show which we will look forward to performing for you all on Thursday 6^{th} Dec (AM)! The children will be writing letters to Santa, creating pieces of festive art and craft and sharing their experiences with one-another. We have a busy time ahead with events and activities and we hope to see all of our school community taking part and having a good time. Our annual nursery *Christmas* Fair will take place on Friday 7^{th} December in the school hall from 6.30pm-8.30pm. There will be a raffle at the fair which has LOTS of FANTASTIC prizes available to win!

We would like to remind carers that all children should be in school by 9.15am and can be collected from 1.15pm-1.30pm. (If you will be late in leaving your child to school or need to collect them before 1.15pm please speak to a member of the nursery team.).

Important Information;

- We try to get outside every day for a short time. If your child is not well enough to be outdoors, or is on a course of medication, then it is best that they remain at home as there are insufficient numbers of staff to supervise one or two children indoors during this time.
- The Lending Library starts on Friday 9th Nov. Each child will be encouraged to select a few books to bring home weekly to share with their parents/carer. This is a great opportunity for you to enhance your child's learning and development, potentially across all areas of the curriculum. It is also a great, and inexpensive way for your child to experience and explore a wide range of books and stories! Each child will bring a book bag home every Friday, with their library book in it, and we request that library books and bags are returned every Tuesday.
- As well as the children's lending library we run an **Adult's Lending Library** in the foyer of the nursery. Please feel free to have a browse through the range of general interest, child development and self-help books in the book stand. Simply enter your name and the book in the blue note book provided and enjoy the range of materials available to you.
- Thank you to all parents who were able to attend the parent meetings in October, we hope you found this as valuable and informative as we did. A copy of your child's term one report will be sent home for your records. Please remember the staff are here at any time to discuss any concerns or answer questions as best we can.
- Breakfast club is now open to all nursery children and we have many who are availing of this in the mornings.
